The Clinic offers a wide range of outpatient psychological services to children, adolescents, adults, couples, and families. The Psychology Clinic is open to children, adults, and families living in the Richmond and surrounding Central and Eastern Kentucky communities, including ECU faculty and staff. There are no eligibility requirements for applying to the clinic. Because it is a training facility with a limited number of staff, the Clinic reserves the right to decide which potential clients can best be served at any given time. Fees for therapy are set on a sliding scale from \$6.00 to \$40.00 for each visit. They are based on a person's income, number of dependents, and ability to pay. The Clinic does not accept insurance payments at present, but sets fees that will not be a burden to the client. Fees for assessment services are also based on a sliding scale.

INTRUST HEALTHCARE is a licensed and trusted provider of behavioral therapy and physical rehab services throughout the state of Kentucky. Provides services to all schools in Garrard, Madison, and Rockcastle counties. Impact Plus Services include: individual therapy, collateral therapy, in-home therapy, group sessions (anger management, social skills, etc.), therapeutic child support (mentoring program), and case management.

Children entering the Impact Plus Program must meet the following criteria:

- Be eligible for Medicaid
- Be under the age of 21
- Be at risk of institutional, hospital or other out of home placement
- Be identified as having a severe behavioral health disorder that has persisted for the past 6 months and is expected to persist for at least 6 months without intervention
- Be identified as having complex treatment needs

Once the child meets criteria for the program, the Case Manager will work with the parents or caregivers, as well as other service providers, to form a service team. Parents or caregivers are an integral part of the service team. Once a service team is established, the team may determine that additional services are needed. The team may suggest providers they deem appropriate for each service but ultimately the parent or guardian has the freedom to choose which provider they will utilize.

The shelter has a men's dorm and a women's dorm; each dorm sleeps eight people. A family room is available for mothers with children. Single individuals must be 18 or older, and have a picture ID and a social security card.

These stops include stores, apartment communities, city and county offices and businesses. The Berea route is on an hour-long loop and riders will be able to get off at any stop. The Richmond route is on two 90-minute loops and riders will be able to get off at any stop. Wheelchair assisted door-to-door service is available for no additional cost. In Richmond, both buses are wheelchair accessible. Bulk passes are available. Foothills riders can count on courteous drivers and safe, efficient transportation to school, work, senior citizen centers, adult and child care centers, medical facilities and recreational destinations.

- ❖ A single person with a disabling condition who is living on the streets (place not meant for human habitation) or in a shelter.
  - HUD defines “disabling condition” as “diagnosable substance use disorder, serious mental illness, developmental disability, or chronic physical illness or disability, including the co-occurrence of two or more of these conditions. A disabling condition limits an individual’s ability to work or perform one or more activities of daily living.”
- ❖ This person must have been continuously homeless for a year or more or has had at least for episodes of homelessness in the past three years.

**Lifeline and Link-up Programs (Affordable Telephone Service)**

Lifeline helps with the monthly costs of telephone service. Qualified applicants will receive a credit on their monthly bill. The credit is limited to one line per household at the principle place of residence.

Link-Up Kentucky helps pay for the connection of new telephone service. If you don't already have a telephone, Link-Up can provide a reduction of up to 50% on service connection and installation charges. It may be possible to pay the remaining connection charges over a period of several months.

In Kentucky, an adult recipient of any of these programs is eligible: Medicaid, Food Stamps, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Federal Public Housing, Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). Just call your local telephone company.

**Fees for Service**

All fees for patients without medical insurance are assessed on a sliding scale and based on family income. Various discounts are available based on the following criteria:

- Uninsured patients: As a Community Health Center, the BCHC provides a discount to uninsured patients and their dependents. To receive this discount, the person/family must document family income and household size.
- Family Planning: Through the Title X program, the BCHC offers all family planning services on a sliding fee scale.
- Vaccines: Through the Vaccines for Children Program, the BCHC offers vaccines on a sliding fee scale.
- Lab work and Radiology: The BCHC maintains contracts with Quest Labs and Lexington Diagnostic to offer certain procedures on a sliding fee scale.

**Deposits:** All self-pay patients are asked to bring a \$25 deposit at the time of their appointment. Patients with private insurance should bring the standard co-pay amount specified by their insurance provider.

CCC staff provides short term home based intervention services from birth to age 18. Participation in the CCC Program is voluntary. Following a discussion with the referral source about the program's services, the family needs to consent to participate. Services address children's physical, mental, emotional and educational needs while providing families with the help they need to prevent removal of children from the home and move toward healthy long-term safety and stability.

The In-Home Service Specialist, together with the referral source, will work with each family to help meet their specific goals using the Family Wellness Curriculum. Intensive short-term home based interventions are aimed at assisting families in learning to live together in an environment that is safe and nurturing. Referrals can be made by any community partner, DCBS, or they can be self referred.
